FAS Appendix 2 - Financial assistance for marketing for financial services	 PURPOSE: Marketing activity - Must be off-Island, attendance at exhibitions, design of work, visiting potential new clients To allow businesses the opportunity to gain new clients and business Support attendance at conferences and exhibitions where the applicant is making a presentation at an event off-Island SUPPORT AVAILABLE: Assistance up to 40% of eligible expenditure up to max of £20,000 (Only one application permitted in a calendar year) Activities which may be eligible for assistance include; travel and accommodation, arrangement of bespoke events such as presentations, this can include room hire and event organisation costs 	4b. FAS Appendix 4 - Financial assistance for visitor economy marketing activity	PURPOSE: To support businesses that wish to increase the awareness of the Island as a visitor destination, to increase visitor numbers, and visitor spending and to attract additional out of season visitors (Oct- Feb) To support initiatives that target new markets SUPPORT AVAILABLE: Assistance up to 40% of the cost of marketing activity will be considered, with a maximum of £30,000 per business in a 12 months period IMPORTANT NOTE - Support cannot be offered towards day to day marketing expenditure. If applications are submitted for repeat activity the amount of funding may be reduced in subsequent years	4d. FAS Appendix 5 - Financial assistance for business in difficulty	PURPOSE: The Department will consider supporting eligible businesses that are experiencing financial difficulties, factors taken into account include; the sustainability of the business, impact on the economy if the business were to cease trading, growth prospects, and sources of capital SUPPORT AVAILABLE: The Department recognises that each case if different and that prompt resolution is often required in such cases; therefore it is recommended that any business which may be seeking such financial assistance speaks to the Department before making an application
4e. FAS Appendix 6a - Employee Relocation Incentive	 PURPOSE: To encourage job growth and the import of skills in certain sectors and to expand the Island's workforce and thus generate additional tax revenue Many existing Island businesses require additional skilled staff who are not available locally SUPPORT AVAILABLE: Grant paid retrospectively to the applicants business, the grant is based on the calculation of 20% of the net salary paid to an eligible employee with a minimum salary of £25,000 following their first year of employment on the Island, and is capped at up to £10,000 IMPORTANT NOTE - The employee(s) cannot have taken up position prior to an application being made. Job Sector eligibility does apply, the full list of eligible positions can be found in the Scheme guidance 	4f. FAS Appendix 6b - Graduate Role Incentive	 PURPOSE: The Department is seeking to encourage an expansion to the Island's graduate workforce, and to reverse the increasing dependency ratio The incentive aims to offer support to assist with short-term financial costs associated with employing a graduate (such as training) Minimum gross annual salary in respect of which assistance is sought is £21,000 SUPPORT AVAILABLE: Assistance is by way of a grant, paid retrospectively, of 20% of the salary paid to the graduate employee for their first year of employment on the Island, a maximum of £6,000 per graduate In addition, an Employer NI refund is available subject to the same requirements up to a maximum of £3,055 per employee



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4g. FAS Appendix 14 -
Seasonal Worker
Incentive

PURPOSE:

 The Department is seeking to encourage an expansion of the Island's tourism and hospitality workforce and secondary supporting sectors

ELIGBLE SECTORS:

· Eligible businesses recruiting into the tourism, hospitality and retail sectors and the fishing and seafood processing sector with applicants meeting the eligibility criteria may apply for financial assistance

SUPPORT AVAILABLE:

- Assistance of £1,000 per employee. 50% of the grant paid after first month. Remainder to be paid after six months of paid employment

4i. FAS Appendix 8 -Support for additional childcare & nursery provision

PURPOSE:

- It has been highlighted that there is an acute shortage of nursery and childcare facilities for 0-5 year old children, particularly provision for under 2 years
- The lack of necessary facilities is a factor which can inhibit economic growth preventing parents returning to work and acting as a barrier for those considering relocation to the Island

SUPPORT AVAILABLE:

- Up to 100% rent for 12 months
- Up to 40% towards modifications required to buildings
- Up to 40% towards equipment, toys, play equipment, computers etc.

4h. FAS Appendix 7-Financial assistance in respect of research & development

PURPOSE:

- To facilitate research and development which would lead to the business developing innovative products or services with future commercial potential. In turn this is expected to lead to high-value export growth and job creation
- Qualifying expenditure may include; testing and development of an innovative idea, an early stage feasibility study, prototyping, market tests etc.
- On-Island wage costs may also be considered for an employee*
- · Applications are reviewed on factors including; job creation, commercial potential of product or service, business track record, and timescales

SUPPORT AVAILABLE:

Total financial assistance (excluding wage costs) is capped at £25,000 per annum.

PURPOSE: 4j. FAS Appendix 11 -**Accessibility grants**

• The Equality Act 2017 imposes an obligation on businesses to make adjustments to its services that allows individuals with disabilities to access services as close as reasonably possible as non-disabled people. The grant aims to assist businesses with making their services and premises more accessible and alleviate some of the financial impacts of making the changes

SUPPORT AVAILABLE:

- Up to 50% towards permanent modifications required to premises, which may include signage, handrails, step edges, door handles, automatic doors, ramps, lifts, lighting, contrasting floor coverings, low counters, stair lifts, accessible facilities,
- Up to 50% of plant and machinery costs, which may include specialist furniture, counter or room induction loops with testing devices, portable payment terminals,
- Up to 50% towards website modifications for accessibility purposes
- Up to 50% towards other reasonable adjustments, at the Department's discretion
- Grant capped at £7,500



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4k. FAS Appendix 12 - Financial Assistance for marketing the Island as a destination

PURPOSE:

- Following the approval of the Locate Strategy in 2019, this supports the private sector in reaching out to audiences that may consider investing in, and relocating to the
- · Aims to stimulate this activity with financial assistance that is available on a match funded basis for marketing activity where the goal is to relocate businesses and individuals. *Eligibility may be subject to change after 31st October 2021

KEY FEATURES:

- Assistance available is up to 50% of eligible expenditure, up to a maximum of £10,000 per annum per business
- The assistance is available for a period of 12 months and is subject to Department funds
- Total financial assistance to a group which comprises a number of companies will be limited to £10,000 per year except in exceptional circumstances

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must demonstrate that financial assistance is required for initiatives which promote the Island, are likely to attract business and/or individual relocations or new business
- Qualifying businesses should have more than one member of staff (other than the owner)

ACTIVITIES ELIGIBLE FOR ASSISTANCE:
